Forrest Restoration Program 2026

Forest Restoration Program (Rừng Xanh Lên) is a program initiated by PanNature in 2022, connecting nearly 30 businesses and communities to jointly revive degraded forests. After 3 years, the program has restored over 300 hectares of forest in the Northwest and Central Highlands regions.



Hello, thank you to Enterprises and the Community for your interest and desire to contribute to biodiversity restoration

The Northwest and Central Highlands are high biodiversity regions of Vietnam, home to many rare species of flora and fauna.

However, the forests here are being fragmented and severely degraded, no longer capable of natural recovery in the short term. The Northern white-cheeked gibbon, a rare primate species living in Van Ho forest now has only 19 individuals in 4 groups across approximately 1,200 hectares of forest.



Persevering with nature - continuing Green Forest Rising

In 2022, People and Nature Reconciliation (PanNature) initiated the Forrest Restoration Program, connecting nearly 30 enterprises and communities to work together in regenerating degraded forests.

After 3 years, the program has restored over 300 hectares of forest in the Northwest and Central Highlands regions, contributing to biodiversity recovery and spreading the spirit of action for Vietnam's nature.

One planting season, many years of protection

Each tree planted comes with the responsibility for continuous care, protection, and monitoring. Going beyond tree planting, the program focuses on restoration quality, local community participation, and transparent monitoring mechanisms.



Planting multipurpose tree species

Combining forest restoration to increase living habitats for wild animals, while creating livelihoods for local people (tree species that can yield non-timber forest products when mature)

Coordinating with local government, forest rangers and forest owners

These entities will also help monitor and supervise the restored forest areas

Monitoring survival rates, gap-filling planting and protection

The restored forest area will be monitored by local people for survival rates, gap-filling planting, and protection under PanNature's supervision and support for 3-5 years after planting

Application of technology in forest monitoring

Monitoring forests through the use of new technologies to track annual forest developments

- The border area between Phu Tho and Son La provinces (Mai Chau district, former Hoa Binh province and Van Ho district, Son La province), including Hang Kia - Pa Co Nature Reserve, Xuan Nha Nature Reserve
- Climate-vulnerable and landslide-risk areas in Gia Lai



Planting season: April - October 2026. Priority dates include:

- 22 May: International Day for Biological Diversity
- 5 June: World Environment Day
- Events within the framework of the National Tourism Year 2026 in Gia Lai
